

Overview of the program

The Commercial Building Disclosure (CBD) Program requires most sellers and lessors of large office spaces to provide energy efficiency information to prospective buyers and tenants. We collect and publish this information to make available clear and credible energy efficiency and greenhouse emissions data. This is created to create a more informed commercial property market, and encouraging more energy efficient buildings and reduced emissions.

What is CBD?

The CBD Program mandates the disclosure of energy efficiency information for commercial office spaces of 2000 square metres or more. Disclosure of this information before sale or lease assists prospective buyers and tenants to make informed decisions. The CBD Program is an initiative of the Council of Australian Governments (COAG) and is delivered by the Australian Government Department of Industry, Innovation and Science.
